RESOLUTION NO. 2021-17**

**A PROCLAMATION DECLARING AN EXTENSION OF THE STATE OF  
EMERGENCY IN THE CITY OF LOCK HAVEN DUE TO THE THREAT OF THE  
NOVEL CORONAVIRUS COVID-19 (SARS-CoV-2)**

WHEREAS the Mayor of the City of Lock Haven did issue a declaration of a State of Emergency on March 18, 2020 under §11203 of the Third Class City Code, as amended by action of City Council on April 1, 2020, May 4, 2020, July 20, 2020, and September 23, 2020; and

WHEREAS those directives therein proclaimed require amending due to changing circumstances and the necessity of an extension of the State of Emergency to continue to deal with the COVID-19 emergency; and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT PROCLAIMED that the Mayor of Lock Haven pursuant to the provisions of Section 7501 of the Pennsylvania Emergency Management Services Code, (35 PA C.S., Section 7501), as amended, does hereby amend and extend the proclamation of a disaster emergency in the City of Lock Haven as adopted and amended THAT

- City Council will continue to meet by videoconference throughout the Commonwealth's Proclamation of Disaster Emergency as enabled by Act 15 of 2020; and may also choose to meet in-person in Council Chambers after May 31, 2021 provided that capacity does not exceed 75% and that all unvaccinated participants wear a mask;
- City Authorities, Boards, and Commission may meet by videoconference throughout the Commonwealth's Proclamation of Disaster Emergency as enabled by Act 15 of 2020; and may also choose to meet in-person in Council Chambers after May 31, 2021 provided that capacity does not exceed 75% and that all unvaccinated participants wear a mask;
- City Hall's guarded entryway will be open during regular business hours to visitors who want to drop off payments or other paperwork, visitation beyond the entryway will be by appointment only, individuals who are not fully vaccinated must wear a mask while on-site;
- The Second Avenue Garage will be open to residents intending to drop off yard waste at the facility during regular business hours, all other visitors must have an appointment; individuals who are not fully vaccinated must wear a mask while on-site;
- The Wastewater Treatment Plant is only open to visitors with an appointment;
- All city parks, fields, and outdoor play and common use areas will regulated by the guidance of the Pennsylvania Recreation and Parks Commission;
- The city-owned Ross Library facility must adhere to COVID-19 guidance and recommendations for reopening from the State Library of Pennsylvania;

- The city-owned Station Gallery facility must adhere to COVID-19 guidance and recommendations for reopening from the Pennsylvania Historical and Museum Commission and the Pennsylvania Council On The Arts;
- Any employee who is fully vaccinated as defined by the CDC may work without a mask whether indoors or outdoors and employees who are not fully vaccinated must continue to wear a mask at all times while working;
- The City Manager is directed to make further clarifications to the city's COVID-19 masking and workplace safety policies to enable employees to adhere to the guidance of the CDC and Pennsylvania Department of Health including policies regarding quarantine.

BE IT FURTHER PROCLAIMED THAT if the Governor of the Commonwealth or Secretary of the Department of Health were to institute stricter measures to combat the spread of COVID-19, that those stricter provisions shall supersede any lesser restrictions in this proclamation.

This Proclamation shall become effective immediately on this 17 day of May 2021 as issued by the Hon. Mayor Joel Long of the City of Lock Haven and as approved by City Council attested to by the signature of the Hon. Vice President of Council Stephen Stevenson and shall remain in effect until repealed by action of City Council.
